$12^{\prime \prime}$ square of quilter's muslin or your choice of background fabric.
Embroidery threads of your choice.

Trace the pattern on page 2 onto the piece of background fabric, using a pencil or fabric marking pen.
Use backstitch for everything.

## Block 2-Patience



## What you need:

$12^{\prime \prime}$ square of quilter's muslin or your choice of background fabric.
Embroidery threads of your choice.

Trace the stitchery onto a piece of quilter's muslin, using a pencil or fabric marking pen.
Use backstitch for everything, except the dots.
For the dots stitch French or Colonial knots.

## Block 3-Peace



## What you need:

12 " square of quilter's muslin or your choice of background fabric.
Embroidery threads of your choice.

Trace the stitchery onto a piece of quilter's muslin, using a pencil or fabric marking pen.
Use backstitch for everything. At the end of the butterfly's antennae, stitch French knots.

## Block 4 - Kindness



## What you need:

12 " square of quilter's muslin or your choice of background fabric
Embroidery threads of your choice.

Trace the pattern on page 2 onto a piece of quilter's muslin, using a pencil or fabric marking pen.
Use French knots for the insides of the flowers, and backstitch for everything else.
NB The photo of the stitchery is not necessarily the size of the finished product. The pattern below is the correct size.

## Block 5-Gentleness



## What you need:

12 " square of quilter's muslin or your choice of background fabric Embroidery threads of your choice.

Trace the stitchery onto a piece of quilter's muslin, using a pencil or fabric marking pen.
Use backstitch for everything.
At the end of the butterfly's antennae, stitch French knots.

Block 6-Joy


## What you need:

$12^{\prime \prime}$ square of quilter's muslin or your choice of background fabric.
Embroidery threads of your choice.

Trace the pattern onto the piece of background fabric, using a pencil or fabric marking pen.
Use backstitch for most of the design and French or Colonial knots for the middle of the flower.

## Block 7 - Goodness



## What you need:

12 " square of quilter's muslin or your choice of background fabric.

Embroidery threads of your choice.

Trace the pattern onto the piece of background fabric, using a pencil or fabric marking pen. Use backstitch for everything.

## What you need:

12 " square of quilter's muslin or your choice of background fabric.

Use backstitch and French knots.

Block 9 - Self Control


## What you need:

12 " square of quilter's muslin or your choice of background fabric.
Embroidery threads of your choice.

Trace the pattern onto the piece of background fabric, using a pencil or fabric marking pen.
Use backstitch for everything.
At the end of the butterfly's antennae, stitch French knots.

## Finishing Instructions



We would like to thank you all for joining us on this, our first, 6lock of the month! Thank you for your comments and emails. We have treasured them all. Please send us photos when you have finished yours :)

What you need:

| Fabric A: | Little squares | - scrap |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Fabric B: | Sashing \& Inner border | -55 cm |
| Fabric C: | Second border | -40 cm |
| Fabric D: | Outer border (Feature Fabric) | -90 cm |

1. Trim all embroidered blocks to 8 "
2. Cut four $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares of Fabric $A$

Cut twelve strips of the width of Fabric B.
Set nine of these strips aside and from the remaining three, cut twelve $2 \frac{1}{2}{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 8$ " strips.

3. Sew the four squares of fabric $A$ to three strips of fabric $B$ like this:

4. Sew the remaining $2 \frac{112 \prime}{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips of fabric $B$ between your embroidered blocks like this:

5. Sew the rows from step 2 in between the rows from step 3:

6. For the inner border, use the remaining strips of fabric $B$ and cut:

- two $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 27^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the sides.
- two $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the top and bottom


Your quilt should now measure 31" square.
7. From fabric C cut:

- Two $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31$ " strips for the sides
- Two $21 / 2 \prime \times 37$ " strips for the top and bottom.


Your quilt should now measure $37^{\prime \prime}$ square.
8. Using fabric D for the outer border, cut:

- two $6^{\prime \prime} \times 37$ " strips for the sides
- two $6^{\prime \prime} \times 48.5^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the top and bottom (you will need to join strips for this)


Your finished quilt top should be $48.5^{\prime \prime}$ square.

Pin, quilt and bind as you would any other quilt.
